State of Tennessee Court of Pleas and Quarter
Shelby County Judge and. Session Term. A.D. 1832

This 6 day of November 1832 personally
appeared in open Court before

Judges of the peace for the
County of Shelby appointed to hold the Court of Pleas
& Quarter Judge and for said County John Pope a resident
of the County of Shelby & that aforesaid aged, do hereby
swear the third day of September last, having been
first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath
Make the following declaration in order to obtain
the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7th 1832
That he entered the service of the (United States) in the
Month of July 1861 when he was attached to the
2nd. what was called or he understood to be the Halifax
Regiment & Commanded by Colo. Benjamin Swall William
Brickle Lieutenant Colo. Nathan Mayo Capt. Benjamin
Wheally Lieutenant & Judge Cooper ensign. He volunteered
and took the place of his uncle Nathan Pope a drifter
(man) served six months and up words but did not now
recollect. He joined his Regiment in the neighborhood
of where Raleigh has since been laid out in the State
of North Carolina from there he marched to North
Carolina & stopped on the Roanoke River about five miles
below Chowan hills where the Regiment was caught at
the time Galt was defeated near Camden. They then
returned to North Carolina to a place called Roanoke
Mill on the Roanoke River from there they marched to
Salisbury N.C. where they were stationed for some
length of time and then marched to Charlotte
but had to retreat from Wallace back to Salisbury

and a Cross the Garden River where they remained
for some time and then returned to Salisbury where they
were stationed until his time was out and he
discharged by Colo. Suval whose discharge he has
long since lost: he was in no general engagement
during this time. A note from his own personal
service he furnishes a substitute one killed (word)
for twelve months, who served his time out & returned.
He has no documentary evidence remaining in
his possession by which he can establish these
facts: he knows of no person whose testimony he can
procure, who can testify to his service.

I hereby relinquish any claim to a pension or
annuity what ever except the present & declare that
my name is not on the pension Roll of the
agency of any state.

Q-1st When & in what year were you born
Ans. On the third day of September nineteen hundred & fifty
seven in the state of North Carolina Iwell
County since divided and now Morlon County.

Q-2nd Have you any record of your age, if so when is it
Ans. I have in my possession a copy of the record kept
by my father. The original has long since been destroyed.

Q-3rd Where were you living at the time you were called
in to service: When have you lived since the
Revolutionary War & when do you reside

Ans. In the state of North Carolina Morlon County where
I remained until July 1st 1812 when I moved
to the state of Tennessee and County of Meigs
where I have remained until the present time.

Q-4th How were you called in to service: were you
drafted, did you volunteer, or were you a

a substitute and of a substitute for whom
 And the answer to this is fully contained in my declara-
 25th State the names of some of the Regular officers
 who were with the troops when you served. Such
 Continental & (Militia) Regiments as you can
 be collected & the general circumstances of your service
 sworn to in open Court

 County of Stewart. do hereby certify that we are well
 acquainted with John Ross who has signed the
 above declaration that he is a resident of said
 County that he is respected and beloved in the
 neighborhood when he resides to have been
 a soldier of the Revolution, and that we

 as stated by him to be true, and we further certify that
 John Ross & John Ferrell whose names are
 signed to the preceding certificate, are well standing
 & of reputation in the neighborhood when they reside.
