Circuit Court Papers

1. Summons (2), 1815, to Charles Logan to appear in circuit court for case of Thomas Graves vs. James Hadlock.
2. Bill of Charles S. Hempstead, circuit attorney, against Samuel McKeowin and Francis McKeowin, charged with assault on Polly Bradley, presented to grand jury in June term 1815 (first term of court after creation of Lawrence Co.). The reverse contains this inscription made by Charles Logan:

We the Jury find  
for the United States

1. Bond of CHARLES LOGAN as administrator of estate of PIERRE LE NEUX, 4/19/1817; Joseph Hardin and John Davidson, securities.
2. Bond of ELIJAH VINSON as administrator of the estate of CHARLES LOGAN, 11/9/1819; Thomas Crabtree, Joshua Davis and Spencer Crouch, securities. "Charles Logan died leaving seven children five sons & two daughters legal heirs."
3. Bond of Eli Edmonson as guardian of Mason Logan, infant heir of Charles Logan, deceased, 9/1/1829; James Campbell and Latta Logan, securities.
4. Bond of Latta Logan as administrator of estate of Massy Logan, 11/1/1834; Jonathan Logan and Charles Logan, securities.

6. Power of attorney: Ford Brooks and wife Mason "late of the County of Pope and Territory of Arkansas" to Jesse L. Cravens, 7/9/1833, "to act for us in obtaining our lawful share as heirs at law of the estate of Massy Logan Deceased late of the County of Lawrence and Territory of Arkansas but more recently a ranger in Capt Beans Company".
7. ~~Ex~~ Power of attorney: Ford Brooks and wife Mason to Jesse L. Cravens, 7/10/1833, relating to estate of Charles Logan.
8. Deed: Ford Brooks and wife Mason to Jesse L. Cravens, 7/10/1833, for interest "as heirs at law of & to the estate of Charles Logan Deceased & Mason Logan deceased wife of the said Charles Logan ~~and~~ of the County of Lawrence & Territory of Arkansas ... and to the Estate of Massy Logan Deceased brother of the said Mason Brooks & a late ranger in the Company of Capt Bean".

on said land; that he was then informed he had been on the same before; that he raised a crop on the same in 1804, and had a wife and three children.

DAVID LOGAN, sworn, says that prior to the 20th December, 1803, he was at CHARLES LOGAN'S, the above claimant; that the said LOGAN told him he had planted peach stones, and showed him the place; that the ground had the appearance of having been lately dug up; that, being on the same place early in the spring of 1804, he saw peach trees growing on the same spot shown him by claimant in the preceding year; that claimant had a wife, four children, and three negroes; and that he has actually inhabited and cultivated the same to this day. Permission to settle sworn to.

May 5, 1806: Present, PENROSE and DONALDSON, commissioners. The Board grant said claimant four hundred and sixty arpents of land, situate as aforesaid, provided so much be found vacant there.

August 15, 1811: Present, PENROSE and BATES, commissioners. It is the opinion of the Board that this claim ought not to be granted.
